### **Continued detention of Ms Seher Tümer**

Public Services International (PSI) wrote to you last October concerning the arrest and imprisonment of Ms Seher Tümer, Branch Secretary of PSI's affiliate Sağlık ve Sosyal Hizmet Emekçileri Sendikası (SES) the trade union of public employees in health and social services.

Ms Tümer has now been detained in an F-type prison for almost a year, with no clear charges being brought against her. We are convinced that her arrest is linked to her trade union activities.

PSI reminds your government of its obligations under ILO Conventions 87 and 98, ratified by Turkey, to ensure workers' rights to freedom of association and their right to organise.

PSI has already written to your government on various occasions concerning the harassment and violence inflicted on members of its affiliate, SES, including the curtailment of the rights to freedom of expression and association. PSI calls once more on your government to secure the immediate release of Ms Tümer and to take any necessary steps to guarantee her safety.

PSI once again underlines the fundamental importance of the rights of freedom of expression and association which the Turkish government has an obligation to guarantee to all its citizens. The release of Ms Seher Tümer would be a clear indication of the Turkish government's will to apply these values.
